BREAKING THE MOLD KATA O YABURU, LEADING JAPANESE WOMEN CERAMISTS

Joan Mirviss, Ltd., New York, until 15 December

For many years, Joan has been known as a private dealer with respected expertise in Japanese screens, paintings, wood prints and contemporary and modern ceramics. In her new gallery, opened this year to accommodate requirements for established and new collectors, she has organized this exhibition as a subject-specific show of not just contemporary ceramics, but works by today's leading women ceramic artists.

The eleven artists represented are Fujino Sachiko (b. 1950); Futamura Yoshimi (b. 1959); Hoshino Kayoko (b. 1949); Katsumata Chieko (b. 1950); Kishi Eiko (b. 1948); Kitamura Junko (b. 1956); Koike Shoko (b. 1943); Mishima Kimiyo (b. 1932); Ogawa Machiko (b. 1946); Sakurai Yasuko (b. 1969); and Tashima Etsuko (b. 1959.)

Until only recently, the modern ceramic tradition Japanese had been dominated by artists such as Kitaoji Rosanjin et al., with women relegated to minor roles in production and administration. In recent years, however, female artists have been able to establish themselves as an innovative, experimental and exciting branch to the ceramic tradition. These eleven women have each emerged from different

traditions and backgrounds. Stirred by these diverse traditions and backgrounds, and as women, they have imbued their works with new and unique senses of emotion and expression, creating ceramic styles with wide ranges of materials, textures, forms and colors.
